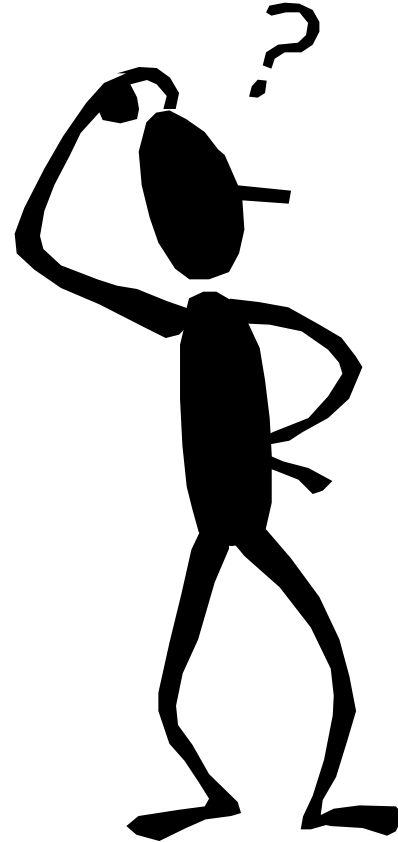


Adverbs

- A word used to modify a verb, an adjective, or another adverb
- Usually answers a question
 - *How?*
 - *When?*
 - *Where?*
 - *To what extent?*
 - how often and how much*



Adverbs

- **Many adverbs are formed by adding *-ly* to the end of an adjective**
 - weak + ly= **weakly**
 - possible + ly= **possibly**
 - formal + ly= **formally**
 - happy + ly= **happily**
- **May appear before or after the verb it modifies**
 - He dressed **formally** for the prom.
 - **Where** are you going?

Adverbs

1. **Time-** today, yesterday, daily, weekly, briefly, eternally
2. **Place-** here, there, nearby, yonder backward, forward
3. **Manner-** precisely, regularly, well, smoothly, badly
4. **Degree-** greatly, entirely, too

Adverbs

1. **Positive form**

Superman runs **fast**.

2. **Comparative form-** (-er or more)

compares two things

Tarzan swings **better** than Superman.

3. **Superlative form-** (-est or most)

compares three or more things

But I, Big Bird, fly the **best** of all.

Adverbs

- **When modifying adjectives and other adverbs, usually tell to what extent something is true**
 - My sister is **mostly** a pain.
 - He did a **very** good job.
 - The fire department was **too** late.
