#### DDD #3 parallel structure (Explanation)

Related items in a sentence should be expressed in a similar way. Single words should be matched with other single words, phrases with phrases, and clauses with clauses. This kind of balanced writing is called **parallel structure**. Careful writers make sure they use parallel structure when related ideas are doing the same work in a sentence.

| FAULTY   | She was not adrift, alone, someone without a name.                     |
|----------|--|
| PARALLEL | "She was not adrift, alone, anonymous"                                 |
|          | [three single-word predicate adjectives]                               |
| FAULTY   | Quindlen writes about her feelings, her impressions, and thinking.     |
| PARALLEL | Quindlen writes about her feelings, her impressions, and her thoughts. |
|          | [three nouns, all objects of a preposition, modified by pronouns]      |
