

Epic Teams- *Iliad* analysis

This is a student directed unit wherein you are responsible for your own learning. In order to make the task a little less daunting, I have divided the class into teams. But with that comes the responsibility of ensuring that you not only learn the content, but that you also help your teammates and other students in class. Although you are working together, I will be issuing individual grades. As you work, I will provide support and observe progress. I will make notes of anyone who is not contributing to the team and provide opportunity for reflection and evaluation at the end.

While reading: (1 Copy per team turned in to me)

- ✓ Paraphrase (restate in your own words) every 50 lines. Each paraphrase should be at least 5 sentences.
- ✓ Answer 10 of the margin questions

After reading: (1 Copy per team turned in to me)

- Find 1 example of flashback (books 1 & 22) or foreshadowing (book 24). Copy the lines and page number. Explain how it is an appropriate example.
- Find 1 simile or metaphor. Copy the lines & page number onto white paper, then illustrate it. Explain the comparison on the back.
- Find 1 examples of verbal or dramatic irony. Copy the lines as well as page number and explain the irony.
- Explain the tone of one of the following speeches: Book 1- Agamemnon line 175-189; Book 22- Hector line 119-156; Book 24- Andromache lines 338-363. In addition to identifying the tone (using one of your tone vocabulary words we have studied in class), explain why you believe it is such and provide direct quotes from the speech for support.
- Develop 10 multiple choice test questions for your book. These are items that you would expect the class to know after your presentation. Each questions must have 4 possible answers (A, B, C, D) with only one correct choice.

Your team will be responsible for presenting/teaching your book (1, 22, or 24) to the class. I expect you to cover each of the elements above as well as provide a thorough review of the events in your book (revisit your paraphrase and the margin questions). You may use PowerPoint, Google slides, Prezi, or any other format you wish for the class presentation. You should consider what information the other students in class need to know and how you can ensure that they receive the content. Just make sure that I have the ability to show your presentation BEFORE the day you present. I do not need a copy of your presentation as I will be observing in class. However, I will collect all of the work listed above (a total of 7 components).
