
# Standard 5 Paragraph Essay An easy outline format to follow

5 paragraphs- the basic essay

- 1. Introductio
- 2. Body #1
- 3. Body #2
- 4. Body #3
- 5. Conclusion

The five paragraph essay form looks like:



This form is sometimes called "hamburger writing"

## What's so important about the Introduction

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- It indicates the topic of the essay
- It gives an idea of the essay's organization
- It establishes the tone of the essay
- It provides background on the topic's importance
- It provides a CLEAR statement of the essay's intended purpose in...

... THE THESIS STATEMENT!

#### **Topic Sentence**

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One of the first people I met was Joe Frieda. I first met Joe standing in a line at the bookstore. 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#### Sample Conclusion

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The themes of fear and danger are conveyed through the use of literary elements in Richard Connell's The Most Dangerous Game. Foreshadowing, imagery and irony are all used to create the mood and develop the suspenseful plot in a way that is entertaining to the reader. Using these literary devices, Connell draws the reader in and keeps the pages turning through to the ending. He shows that the use of these devices is essential for telling an interesting story.
